### **Hy Rosenberg** *Partner*

BlueSky Mod co-founder Hy Rosenberg was born in Toronto. A graduate of the University of Toronto and Osgoode Hall Law School, he has practiced law since 1971 and has been a partner in the firm Rosenberg, Dwyer since 1995.

An entrepreneur with a longstanding interest in architecture and design, he has undertaken many renovation and building projects over the years. He was a founding partner and owner/operator of the Blue Angel Restaurant, a critically acclaimed retro Art Deco Restaurant/Bar/Club that was an integral part of the nascent Queen St. scene in the late 1970s and early 1980s.

In 1980 he introduced Canada to Haagen Dazs ice cream. He sees BlueSky Mod as the next logical step in expressing his entrepreneurial interests. The company combines his interests in architecture and business potential and culminates two years of research into global trends in modernist pre-fabricated home development.

### **Richard Stark** *Partner*

BlueSky Mod co-founder Richard Stark is president and owner of Collaborative Ventures, a construction management and general contracting company that specializes in custom-home construction and residential renovation. Raised in Toronto, Richard graduated with a degree in urban and regional planning from Ryerson University in 1979 and a bachelor's of law from the University of Western Ontario in 1983.

He is a frequent collaborator with high-profile designers and architects and has built a reputation for quality and reliability in projects that require an innovative approach and exacting standards in construction detailing.

Richard co-founded two other construction-related businesses: a Toronto dealership for Pella windows and Carter Richer + Stark, a stone carving and conservation masonry company. He is also a councillor in the Township of Carling, a recreation-based municipality on the eastern shore of Georgian Bay, where he has cottaged for most of his life.

### **Todd Saunders** *Prototype Architect*

Architect Todd Saunders designed the BlueSky Mod prototype cabin. His work combines a Nordic design sensibility with environmental concerns. He has been published in leading international design journals, including Architectural Record, Architecture Now!, Blueprint, Monument and Wallpaper.

Born and raised in Canada, Todd emigrated to Bergen, Norway in 1997 where he established Saunders Architecture. He currently teaches at the Bergen Architecture School and has lectured in Scandinavia, Canada and England. His awards include scholarships from the Norwegian Association of Artists, the National Business and Development Association and an environmental prize for a schoolyard designed and built with parents and students.
